<b>Logistics Support</b>	<p>SIS provides logistics support to the CDC’s Division of Emergency Operations (DEO) for its PHEM Fellowship program that trains public health professionals in 22 countries to function as emergency responders and develop emergency management plans for disease outbreaks and emergency response efforts. We also coordinate logistics and training for the 3-month PHEM Fellowship program in Atlanta, GA.</p> <p>For the DEO, SIS provided logistics support in Cameroon for emergency and incident manager training and training of master trainers.</p> <p>SIS supported CDC’s National Center for Environmental Health (NCEH) and provided facilities management and office automation support to internal and external stakeholders. This included inventory and storage management, cataloging, and property utilization related to depot, local, and other supply activities.</p> <p>SIS also supports the USAF’s Warner Robins Air Logistics Center in improving the supportability of USAF aircraft with the application of lean tools and technology, transformation, and other continuous process improvement efforts related to material and supply requirements. This includes performing audits, parts delivery, customer support, and contractor/vendor compliance.</p>
<b>Distribution and Supply Chain Management</b>	<p>SIS supported the DoD, Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR) in the purchase, repacking, storage, and delivery of medications to the Kintampo District Hospital in Ghana.</p>

<b>Emergency Response and Crisis Management</b>	<p>For the CDC’s Division of Emergency Operations, SIS supports the 3-month Atlanta-based emergency response training at the CDC of global PHEM (Public Health Emergency Management) Fellows who develop emergency management plans for implementation in their home countries.</p> <p>SIS also supported the development of the PHEM curriculum for 22 countries impacted severely by COVID-19, including several countries in Africa. We developed 25 in-person and virtual courses and materials for incident manager training and implemented the training with in-country trainers.</p>
